Following years of lobbying, we celebrate the introduction of mandatory relationships and sex education (RSE) in all secondary schools in England from September 2020. During 2018/19, Brook contributed to the consultation and development of the new guidance for schools. We are committed to ensuring that the legislation is improved and that everyone is effectively supported to deliver the kind of quality RSE that young people have consistently told us they want and need.

BROOK BELIEVES:

EVERY YOUNG PERSON must be able to build a healthy and happy life and have positive relationships, including sexual ones. Effective relationships and sex education must be relevant and appropriate to the lives of children and young people, regardless of their family background, ethnicity or religion.

EVERY TEACHER should be upskilled to provide holistic support to young people. All teachers should be equipped to speak to young people confidently about their health and wellbeing and should have access to factually accurate, rights based and high-quality continued professional development and resources.

EVERY SCHOOL should be supported with a quality framework and processes. These should align policy, people and practice, curriculum and students in such a way that meaningful provision is established.

Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) becomes mandatory in schools in England from September 2020.

WHAT IS RSE?

Relationships and Sex Education teaches young people about the biological, developmental and emotional aspects of sex, sexual development, sexuality and relationships. RSE should be evidence-based, drawing on accurate scientific and medical information and directing young people to reliable sources of accurate information.

WHY IS IT BENEFICIAL?

The provision of good quality RSE helps young people to make informed decisions about their sexual relationships and provides skills which help to protect young people emotionally and physically. It can also help to delay first sex, ensure a smaller age gap between sexual partners at first sex, and increase condom use. Those who have received comprehensive RSE are less likely to be treated for an STI in the future.

Quality RSE also helps to strengthen protective factors to combat sexual exploitation and abuse.

The 2012 Ofsted report of schools across England discovered that over a third of schools required improvement in their RSE.

Many young people were discovered to be "unprepared for the physical and emotional changes they will experience during puberty, and later when they grow up and form adult relationships".

WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR SCHOOLS?

Before 2020 it is necessary for schools to:

- Implement mandatory RSE
- Create a practical, achievable action plan
- Develop an RSE policy
- Invest in the development of staff
- Embed RSE in the school culture and moral framework of the school
- Identify and overcome legal, social, cultural, religious and moral challenges in relation to RSE

HOW CAN BROOK HELP YOU?

RSE WORKSHOPS

Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) of Boys and Young Men (BYM)

FULL DAY

This course aims to develop the confidence of professionals working with young people, and raises awareness of the specific risks posed to boys and young men from Child Sexual Abuse/ Exploitation.

A young man is highly unlikely to disclose to a professional that they are at risk of or experiencing CSE. Therefore exercising professional curiosity is critical to enabling a young man to get the right level of support. Throughout the day you will explore signs and indicators of online risks, among others. Participants are also given the opportunity to identify issues relevant to their own working context.

- Identify the forms of CSA/E and how these apply to BYM
- Recognise professional responses to CSA/E of BYM compared to girls
- Explore case studies of BYM at risk of CSA/E
- Recognise risk indicators in BYM
- Reflect on the societal conditioning of BYM
- Identify the barriers for BYM to disclose or engage in services
- Understand the impact of gender and sexual orientation in the grooming process
- Explore online grooming and the use of technology
- Address BYM victim / perpetrator myths and gender stereotypes
- Understand the context of gender in the 2003 Sexual Offences Act

Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) for SEND Young People

HALF DAY OR Full Day

This session has been designed to support professionals delivering RSE to young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND).

SEND young people have the right to learn about relationships and sex, yet the education may have to be delivered differently. Discussing methods and challenges will allow you to facilitate conversation and provide appropriate education.

- Describe the RSE needs of young people who experience SEND and how these can be met
- Identify the best resources to use for teaching RSE to SEND young people

Sex, Pressures and Social Networks

HALF DAY AND Full Day

The aim of this session is to enable participants to gain knowledge and skills about the influences and pressures young people face as they develop and explore their emerging sexuality.

Many young people communicate with one another using social networks; however, we are increasingly hearing stories of young people sharing pictures and information online with people they have never met and do not know. Understanding why young people do this will enable you to work with them to resist the pressure they face.

Participants will be able to:

- Explain the messages young people receive that influence their sexual life, relationships and self-esteem
- Identify the potential impact of modern media (including social networks, pornography and celebrity culture) and key messages to support young people in negotiating it safely
- Describe how to support young people in making informed choices about their sexual life
- Describe how to encourage young people to think about the importance of positive friendships to build self esteem
- Describe how to equip young people with the skills to say no to sex they don't want and to explore intimacy and sensuality in non-sexual ways

Sexuality and Gender

HALF DAY AND Full Day

The aim of this session is to explore sexuality and gender and provide participants with more indepth knowledge and skills around the topic.

Research shows that people are happier and more productive in an environment in which they feel they can be themselves without fear of harassment or abuse. Although society as a whole is becoming more tolerant of the diversity of sexual orientations, homophobia is still ingrained in many institutions and communities. This continues to have an extremely negative effect on the lives of LGBT+ people.

Participants will be able to:

- Discuss attitudes to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgendered young people
- Discuss stereotypes, judgements and assumptions around sexuality
- Describe LGBT+ issues affecting young people and identify ways of supporting the young people you work with around these issues
- Define and understand terminology demonstrate practical skills to support a young person with a disclosure
- Describe how to develop professional practice to ensure LGBT+ inclusivity within RSE work with young people
- Identify practical ways to challenge homophobia in a youth setting
- Identify where to signpost young people for support

Sexual Behaviours Traffic Light Tool

HALF DAY

Brook's nationally recognised Sexual Behaviours Traffic Light Tool training provides a highly visible, multi-agency response that helps professionals to identify, understand and respond appropriately to sexual behaviours in young people.

The tool and training provide professionals within and across organisations with a framework for identifying whether behaviour is part of healthy development or if it is a cause for concern. It will also provide guidance on when to safeguard and/or signpost to internal or external support. The training equips professionals to make consistent and informed decisions that neither pathologises nor criminalises young people. Participants will be trained to have robust and meaningful conversations around behaviour that causes concern and will be equipped to embed the tool within their practice.

Participants will be able to:

- Categorise behaviours and the law relating to these
- Explain healthy sexual development
- Integrate their newly created action plan into their organisation's toolkit

1-1 TARGETED SUPPORT

Brook's 1-1 support work is part of our wider education offer. It is an early help programme which aims to empower and support young people to improve their own health and wellbeing.

The structure and resources have been codesigned with young people and have been independently evaluated.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Brook's targeted support is educational rather than therapeutic and is based on a supported self-help approach.

The sessions are designed to teach young people personally directed behaviour change skills and include the opportunity to practise the skills they have learned with the support of a Brook specialist. It takes a toolkit approach to the range of resources available, allowing our specialist to create a bespoke programme for each individual young person.

Our 1-1 targeted support is aimed at young people aged 11+ who chose to take part voluntary engagement is key to the programme.

The structure provides a consistent framework for a programme of 1-1 sessions. Support can be delivered either as part of a fixed number of sessions (minimum of 6) or as part of ongoing support for an individual young person.
